



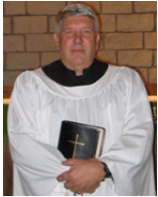

Vergers Installed in Marble Falls

Rev Ann, as she likes to be addressed, told the congregation "she has an Assistant Priest, two seminarians, and now two vergers to help her. How much better could her life be?" Ron Robertson, Guild Training Officer, presented the candidates. The candidates and their families were brought forward and the installation was performed. Bob Bliss, Guild Communications Chair, representing the National Vergers Guild of the Episcopal Church and the Mace Chapter, assisted Rev. Ann in the installation. A reception followed the service where Tom and Pat were congratulated by the congregation.

Finding Liturgical North

The custom of worshipping towards the East, and of building Churches with the Chancel at the East end, has been the rule of the Catholic Church for many centuries. The Altar is therefore at the East end, in token that Christ is our Sun and Light, and that He will come from the East at His second Advent. "And the glory of the Lord came into the House by the way of the gate whose prospect is toward the East" (Ezek. 43, 4).

From the Nave looking toward the Altar you are facing liturgical east. North will be on your left and south to your right. The pulpit is usually placed on the north side, facing west, because ancients thought that the voice had its strength from the right side. The pulpit symbolizes the teaching power and authority of the church.

The Lectern, at which the lessons for the day are read, is ordinarily on the south side of the chancel, facing west. In many churches, however, the positions accorded the Lectern and Pulpit are transposed.
